

If you are ever concerned about your child's condition:

- First, speak with your child's nurse.
- If you are still very concerned after speaking with the nurse or doctor and you do not feel your concerns are being met, call the Rapid Response Team.

What is the Rapid Response Team?

The Rapid Response Team is like calling 911, only it is used inside of the hospital. Making a Rapid Response Team call gives you a way to get help fast if you are ever very concerned about your child's condition. Use it ONLY if you are VERY concerned about your child.

Why would I call the Rapid Response Team?

Call the Rapid Response Team if you are still **very concerned** about your child's condition after speaking with your child's nurse or doctor.

This could include changes in your child like:

- Trouble breathing.
- Not acting right.
- Seems to be getting worse.

How do I call the Rapid Response Team?

Dial 5-8326 (5-TEAM) from your room phone or 404-785-8326 from your cell phone.

Who comes when I call the Rapid Response Team?

A special medical team will come to check your child. Once they check your child, they will call other doctors or staff if needed.

What will happen after I call the Rapid Response Team?

- The team will check your child and answer your questions.
- They may speak with you and your child's nurse or doctor about other types of treatment for your child.
- They may move your child to a higher level of care if needed.

Rapid Response Team calls are ONLY for when you are <u>very</u> concerned about your child.

In case of an urgent concern or emergency after going home, call 911 or go to the nearest emergency department right away.
